


NFL Season Report

Welcome to the fourth edition of Kambi's annual NFL Report

The world of football is gearing up for the resumption of competitive hostilities, with the NFL regular season due to begin on September 8 as the LA Rams look to mount their Super Bowl defence after triumphing over the Cincinnati Bengals at Super Bowl LVI. The Rams will get proceedings underway against the Buffalo Bills, while the Dallas Cowboys take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Miami Dolphins play the New England Patriots in some of the opening week's headline fixtures.

The expansion of regulated sports wagering across the US continues to gather pace and offering a best-in-class NFL betting experience has proven to be crucial in attracting and retaining an engaged customer base.



Game Parlay's popularity among bettors exceeded expectations with more than 40% of NFL bettors placing at least one combination bet during the season, and Kambi plans to offer a range of new bet offers for the upcoming season.

Kambi was also the first to offer college football player props in time for the college football bowl season and College Football Playoff. As Kambi Network data shows, engagement with both college and NFL betting will only continue to grow. 



Approx 30% of GGR for the Championship Game was generated by **Game Parlays**


The National Championship game saw a higher percentage of Game Parlay bets (35%) than the Super Bowl (31%)






Betting activity two hours before the game

Pre-Game Retail




Betting activity two hours before the game










In-Game Price Changes

Most surprising result last season?

The Bengals winning the AFC. They had already surprised everyone by emerging as the winners of a competitive AFC North. Then Cincinnati pulled off an even bigger upset in overturning a 21-3 deficit against the juggernaut that is Kansas City. Even losing the Overtime coin toss couldn't stop them making their first Super Bowl since Cris Collinsworth was still catching passes.

What was the biggest betting trend for the year?

User engagement in our new Game Parlay offering was massive. Touchdown scorer was a big part of that, and a big trend was players building parlays with high payouts by combining Touchdown scorers within and across games.

Most surprising result last season?

Might not be a single result, but most surprising moment for me was the final game of the regular season between the Raiders and Chargers, both needing a win to go to playoffs yet thanks to a Jaguars win earlier in the day a tie would've put both teams through. Unbelievably the game goes to overtime with the Raiders kicking the winning Field Goal in the dying seconds. Just goes to prove that the NFL can continue to surprise us even after 100+ years.

What was the biggest betting trend for the year?

From a live betting perspective, a trend we continued to see all season was players betting on teams that fell behind early in games to make a comeback and win, particularly if the favorite gave up the first Touchdown of the match.

What was a defining moment for traders last season?

Changing of the Guard. Last season felt like a real shift from what we have been seeing for the last 10 or so years with a host of rookies and less experienced players proving they have what it takes to carry the NFL for the next 10+ years. Half of all quarterbacks in the playoffs last year were draft in 2016 or later, and with uncertainty around Aaron Rodgers' future we can expect these guys to become main stays in future seasons.

Most surprising result last season?

A fun result to look back on was third string QB Mike White and the Jets beating the would be AFC champion Bengals in week 8. White completed 37 passes for 405 yards and 3Tds in what will be the best game of his life and something he will be telling the grandkids about the day he beat Joe Burrow.

What was the biggest betting trend for the year?

Definitely the touchdown scorer markets. The most popular thing I saw on Twitter all season was punters combing their favorites to score across the game as well as first touchdown scored. Side note, we are seeing a ton more turnover on first field goal in NBA now, clearly showing customers want action and they want it quick!

What was a defining moment for traders last season?

Defining moment for me is very similar to David and Hugh. The league is now up for grabs with the young extremely talented QB's. The Brady, Ben, Peyton, Brees' have turned into the Mahomes, Allen, Herbert and Burrows and it will be very exciting to watch for a long time.
